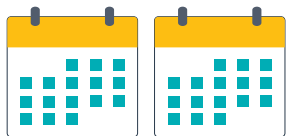

Students of Board-certified teachers learn more—and the impact is greater for minority and low-income students.



A decade of research shows that students of Board-certified teachers outperform their peers without Board-certified teachers. Students taught by NBCTs gained the equivalent of approximately one to two months of additional instruction.

Common Questions & Answers

Q: Who is National Board Certification for?

A: Any teacher in Arizona who wants to elevate their practice and has a baccalaureate degree, a teaching license, and three or more years of experience.

Q: How much will it cost? Is there funding assistance?

A: There are four components a teacher needs to complete certification in three years. The cost of each component is \$475. If you teach in an Arizona public school and complete a National Board Pre-Candidacy Class and National Board Institute through the Arizona K12 Center, the Center will cover the cost of all four components.

Q: What are the expectations of the funding assistance?

A: If you receive funding assistance, we expect you to attend regional monthly cohort meetings, attend our National Board Candidate Kickoff, and teach for one year in an Arizona public school after you complete the process of Board-certification.

Q: How long will it take?

A: While it is possible to complete the process in as little as one year, you have three years to submit all four components.

Q: How do I balance this with my other responsibilities?

A: Recognizing the many demands on teachers' time, the certification process is designed to be flexible. You will decide which components to do when over a three year period. It is your choice! Regardless of the path you take, there is a supportive community of practitioners who have already made this journey ready to help you along the way.

Q: What support will I receive?

A: The Arizona K12 Center offers support to teachers through all stages of the process, including coaching, specialized workshops, and regional cohorts of support.
